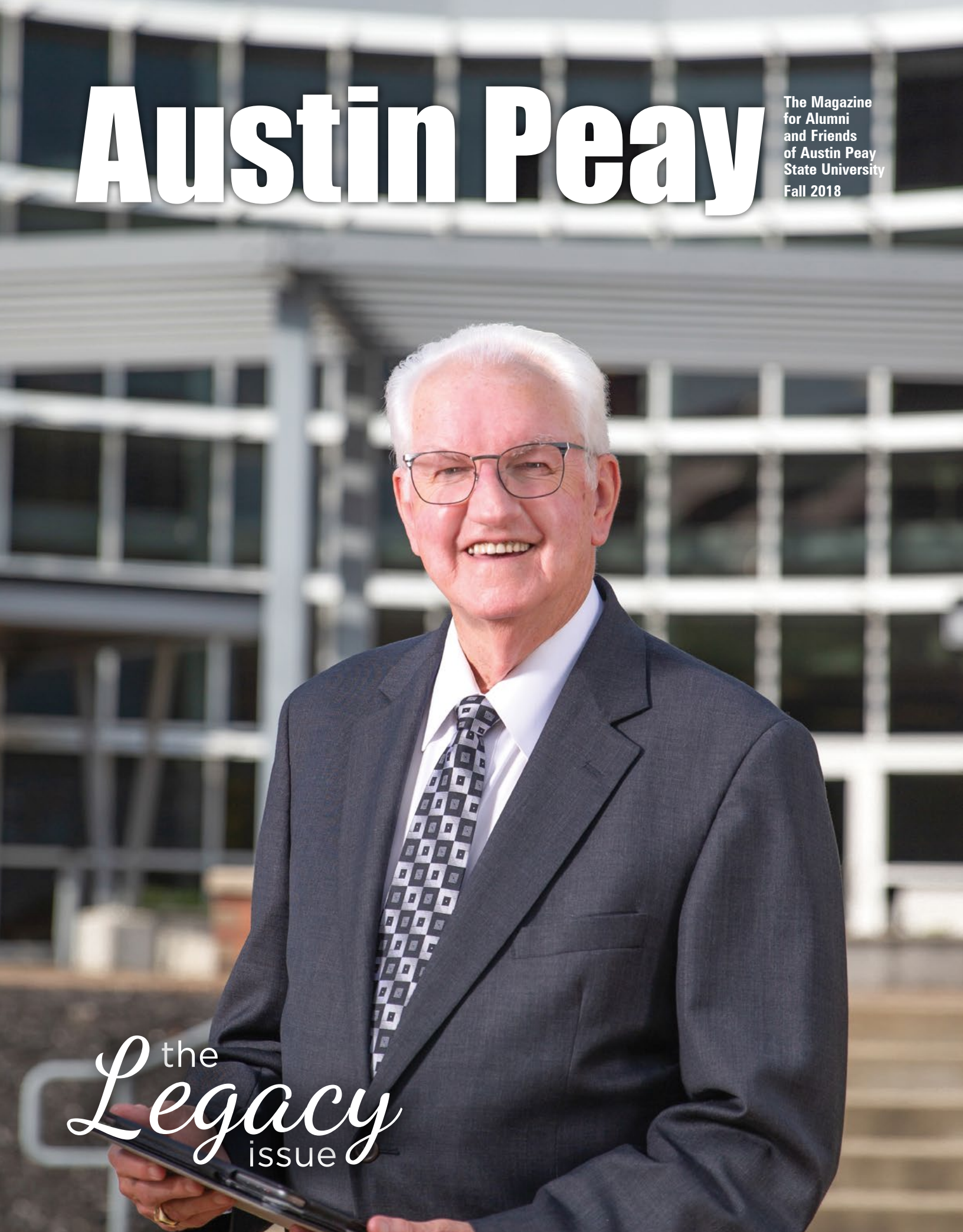

A few months ago, the national higher education marketing firm Stamats studied perceptions about Austin Peay's brand, and they discovered that our faculty, staff, students, alumni and potential students truly value the University's "sense of community." For many of you, Austin Peay is more than a college campus; it's a home. This feeling comes from the love and respect you have for this institution, and in some cases, the feelings result in relationships that span generations.

Recently, I heard a story about O.S. Uffelman, a young World War II veteran, who in the 1950s began wearing a belt with the words "Austin Peay" engraved on the buckle. Uffelman ('49) wore this belt with pride during his long and distinguished career as a Houston County educator. In the decades after he earned his degree, Uffelman's wife, Helen ('77), his daughters Maria ('86) and Minoa ('82, '83), and his granddaughter, Carrie Uffelman Brake ('15), all graduated from Austin Peay. Dr. Minoa Uffelman, one of our distinguished history professors, now often wears her father's belt to welcome new students to campus each August.

With three generations of Austin Peay graduates, the Uffelmans are what we often refer to as a "Legacy Family." In this issue, you'll read about the special connections some legacy families have with Austin Peay. A legacy is about passing something important down to another generation. Austin Peay legacy families pass down their value of a university education and their recognition of the excellent education they earned at Austin Peay to the people they love most. Legacy families have generations of interactions with our University, while others may be the first in their families to build a relationship with the University. Their influence can also be enormous. Dr. Bruce Myers, the recently retired chair of the APSU Department of Computer Science and Information Technology, spent his career transforming one of our small programs into an internationally recognized department. And then there's Evelyn McCampbell, or Ms. Jane, the formerly anonymous donor who made a difference in so many young lives. You'll also find their stories in this issue, as well as other items that might remind you why Austin Peay is such a special place.

For the past 91 years, families have bonded at athletic events, concerts, art openings and lectures on this campus. In the fall, alumni reminisce about their early days as students while moving their children into the residence halls, and in the spring, they celebrate another family member becoming an Austin Peay graduate. Many of you encourage your sons and daughters to attend Austin Peay, because you know firsthand what a positive, transformative experience they can have here, and we do everything we can to make their experience and memories as good as or better than yours. That's why this issue doesn't merely celebrate a university; it celebrates a community.

## DOCTOR OF EDUCATION DEGREE

Austin Peay took a major step this semester by launching its first-ever doctoral program, a Doctor of Education degree in educational leadership for K-12 professionals. The move also raises the University to a doctoral-level classification with the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges.

“APSU joins the ranks of the nation’s doctoral universities,” Dr. Rex Gandy, APSU provost and vice president for academic affairs, said. “With this approval, the University is better positioned to serve the educational needs of students at all degree levels.”

Added Dr. Prentice Chandler, dean of the Eriksson College of Education: “Our University was founded by teachers, so it is fitting that our first doctoral degree program is in the field of education.”

## ANIMAL SCIENCE BUILDING NAMED AFTER BROCK BLICK

On a clear April night, more than 150 community members gathered at the APSU Environmental Education Center and Farm for a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the newly renamed Brock Blick Animal Science Building. Brock Wyatt Blick passed away on Jan. 8, 2017. To honor his lifelong love of agriculture and cattle production, his parents, Mark and Jeri Blick ('98), created the Brock Blick Fund of Excellence in Agriculture and the Brock Blick Distinguished Scholarship in Agriculture. The couple also presented Austin Peay with a 100-year planned estate gift.

In recognition of this gift, the University renamed its \$1 million, state-of-the-art animal science teaching facility as the Brock Blick Animal Science Building. Austin Peay opened the facility in 2016 to provide room for the Department of Agriculture's booming enrollment.

Three APSU students — Holly Bunner, Geno D'Arco and McKenzie Mullins — were selected for the Japanese government's highly selective Japanese Exchange and Teaching (JET) program. They'll spend this year in Japan working as assistant language teachers.



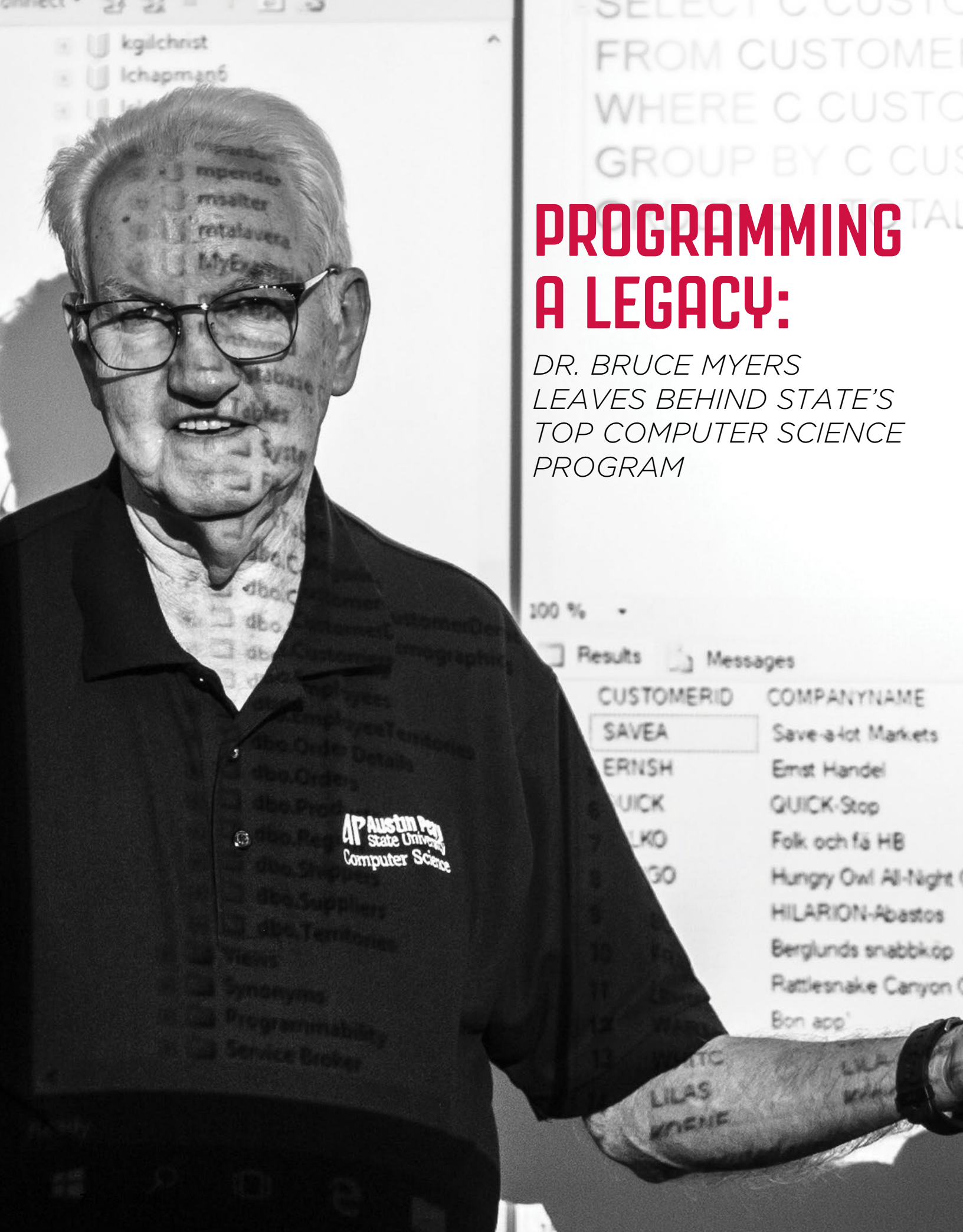
## GOVS GIVE BACK

In 1975, shortly after Bill Gates and Paul Allen formed Microsoft, a young Austin Peay State University math professor decided to teach a computer class. He didn't know what the Microsoft duo was doing out in New Mexico, but the '70s marked a sort of golden age in the young computer world, with the development of the first microprocessor, the floppy disk and the video game "Pong."

"I just got interested in it," Dr. Bruce Myers said. "In my era, people that got our Ph.D.s in math transitioned into computer science. There was a real demand then, but there weren't any computer science faculty."

On Aug. 10, 2018, 48 years after he first arrived on campus, Myers retired as chair of the APSU Department of Computer Science and Information Technology, one of the most innovative and fastest-growing programs at Austin Peay. Though he'll deny it, if one person can be credited with building Austin Peay's reputation as leader in computer science education, it is Myers.

## Building a program

Today, the APSU Department of Computer Science and Information Technology is known as a progressive program, offering such degree concentrations as cybersecurity, software engineering and intelligent robotics. That's a bit different from the early 1970s, when a single math elective covered the topic of computers.

"We had one course, Math 305, on Fortran programming, and it was taught by George Brotherton," Myers said. "We developed a minor in 1976, and then we went to a major in 1979. That's when I transitioned out of math and totally into computer science."

Then, in 2003, everything changed.

## A 21st century program

"In 2003, Dr. (Sherry) Hoppe decided we needed a full department," Myers said. "She basically pulled me off of every committee I was on and told me to work on getting a department organized."

The new computer science department had only four faculty members and two new concentrations in database administration and internet and web technology.

"That's when the numbers really took off," Myers said. "Now we have 10 full-time faculty members and 15 adjuncts. And we have three Bachelor of Science degrees, with the only B.S. degree in networking in the state. The new software engineering program is the second engineering program in our college, following engineering physics."

In 2013, to make room for the growing department, the University opened the Maynard Mathematics and Computer Science Building. The next year, Austin Peay graduated the highest number of computer science majors in the Tennessee Board of Regents system. Thirty percent of those graduates were women, and nearly 27 percent were from underrepresented minority groups. Both of these numbers surpassed the national and state averages for those populations.

"I never doubted the change," Myers said. "I just moved as things moved."

## *Sorenson honored for foreign language teaching*

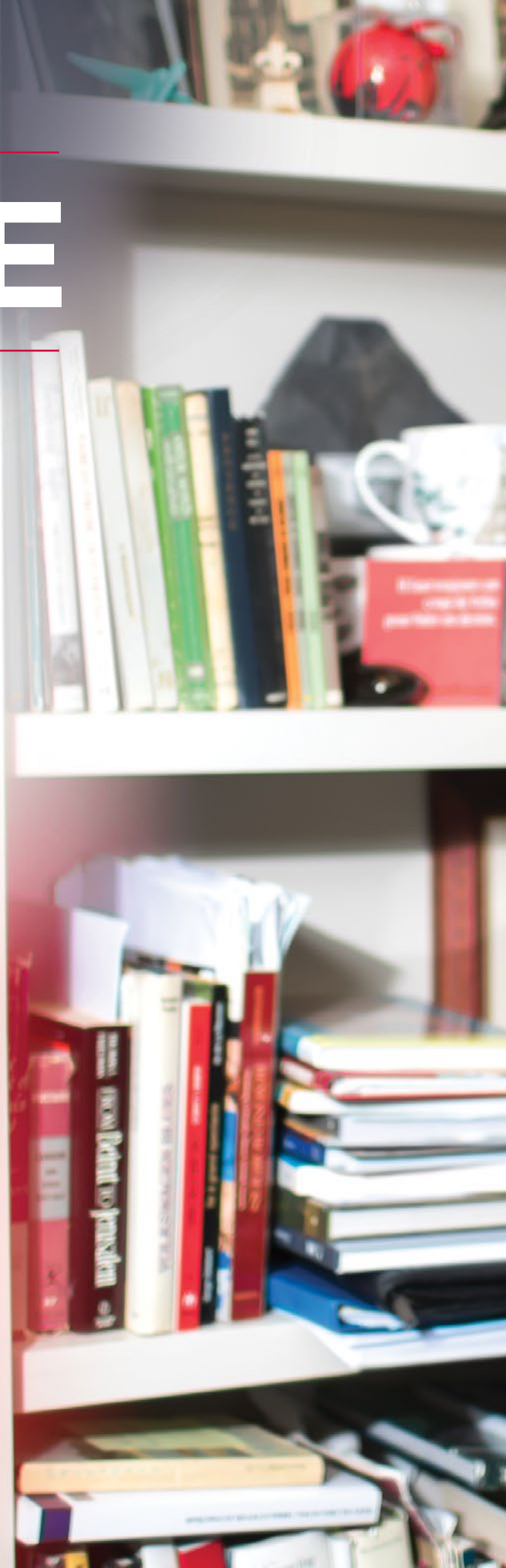
Last year, Dr. Karen D. Sorenson, professor of French, received the Jacqueline Elliott Award for Service in Higher Education by the Tennessee Foreign Language Teaching Association (TFLTA).

For 35 years, TFLTA has presented this award annually to a foreign language educator at the post-secondary level for outstanding service to the profession, but it never went to an Austin Peay professor until Sorenson received it last November.

“This is an award for service to the profession, and I think it’s as much a credit to the way my colleagues value both my work and the work of the entire languages program at Austin Peay in terms of the advocacy work we perform for foreign languages,” she said.

Sorenson was selected for the award, in part, for her commitment to advocacy for foreign language in higher education. As a member and former vice president of the Mid-Continent Consortium for International Education, she has focused on immersion-based foreign study for two languages (French and Spanish) in five countries (Canada, France, Austria, Spain and Mexico).

“As we prepare more and more students to leave college and function in a global world, it’s more important than ever that we integrate foreign language study into our students’ educational experiences,” Sorenson said.

# Malone heads to Twitter for internship







Since 2009, Celeste Malone has been an active Twitter user. From watching live broadcasts to simply tweeting, there is always something for her to explore. Last summer, the APSU communication graduate student used her Twitter and news reporting skills for Periscope — a Twitter subsidiary — as an editorial intern in San Francisco, California. She was selected from 65,000 applicants for the position.

“Twitter has definitely played a major role within my jobs on campus,” Malone said. “I have used it to follow interesting stories for The All State and as a way to find interesting topics to discuss in the Wilbur N. Daniel African American Cultural Center.”

Malone previously served as editor-in-chief of The All State student newspaper, as well as graduate assistant for the African American Cultural Center. When she was editor-in-chief, The All State earned almost 40 awards at state, regional and national competitions.

Malone is working toward her Master of Arts degree in marketing communication.

“In my social media classes, I teach students that they need to think about social media seriously,” Dr. Robert Baron, assistant professor of communication, said. “Celeste serves as a great example of what happens when someone does just that. I’m already trying to book her as a guest lecturer for my fall 2018 social media classes.”

Malone also was recently selected by the APSU Board of Trustees to serve as the 2018-19 student representative.

“APSU has continuously challenged and pushed me to become the person I am today,” she said. “I am truly humbled and honored to represent this campus, The All State, the Wilbur N. Daniel African American Cultural Center and the APSU Communication Department to the best of my ability.”

On May 5, 1975, a new fraternity was chartered at Austin Peay State University. The Theta Beta Chapter of Kappa Alpha Psi soon became a powerful force on campus, with its members engaging in numerous community service projects and serving as student government leaders. Those students became active alumni who shared a love for their alma mater. In fall 2017, several alumni members of Theta Beta Chapter returned to campus to present APSU President Alisa White with a \$25,000 check, officially establishing the Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity/Theta Beta Endowed Scholarship.

**DR. J. LANNETT EDWARDS ('89),**

University of Tennessee professor of animal science, earned her Ph.D. in animal and molecular cell biology from the University of Florida. Upon completion of her degree, she was awarded a postdoctoral fellowship by the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Her postdoctoral work focused on developing procedures to clone adult cattle. With the announcement of the first-ever clone of an adult animal, Dolly the Sheep, USDA provided her the opportunity to work and study cloning procedures at the Roslin Institute in Scotland. Edwards was among the first to produce clones of an adult cow. She was given the Point of Pride Award by the Clarksville-Montgomery County School System for her outreach efforts highlighting the importance of agriculture to STEM-interested youth. She has received numerous other honors and awards for teaching and research.

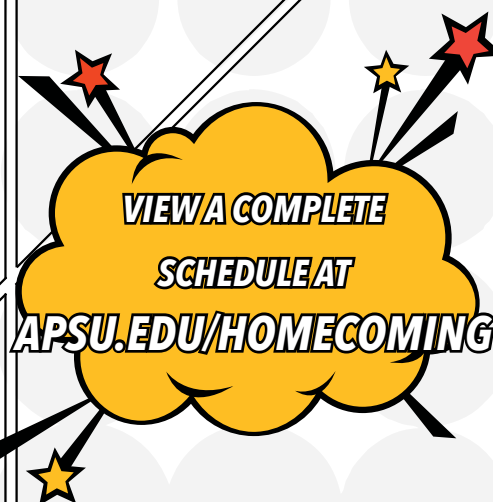

# Legacies:

*families find a home at APSU  
over several generations*



Alisha Jerles Horn ('09, '12) never knew her grandfather, but sometimes, while walking across campus, she pictures him as a tall college student, dressed in an old-fashioned basketball uniform. William Grayford Nutt arrived at Austin Peay in 1937 as a 19-year-old athlete, and sometimes Horn imagines him waving at a pretty, young woman.

“My grandmother used to sit on the porch of her family home off Robb Avenue,” she said. “They formed a friendship and subsequent romance, marrying shortly after he earned his teaching certificate.”

Horn earned her bachelor's degree in psychology and her master's degree in counseling, and as an adjunct instructor, she still finds herself walking through the Clement Building, picturing her father, Dr. Joe Jerles ('71), proposing to her mother, the late Brenda Nutt Jerles ('72).

Horn is part of a legacy family at Austin Peay, with three generations earning degrees from the school. For her, like so many other legacies, the campus is like a living photo album or scrapbook, with family histories and legends lingering around columns of some of the oldest buildings.

"Austin Peay State University isn't just a place that I work or where my family and I went to school," Horn said. "It's family."





## APSU memories

For some legacy families, Austin Peay is such a part of their lives that the campus appears in their earliest memories.

“When I was 4 years old, my mom (Ebony Nicole Parsons) graduated from here, and I was actually there,” Kibriana Parsons ('18) said. “My grandpa (Alexander Otis Parsons Sr.) graduated in 2007. He was in the military, stationed at Fort Campbell, and he really wanted to get an education. I was 12 when he graduated, and I went to that one also.”

The family returned the favor in May, when Parsons earned her degree.

“My grandfather, he drove 14 hours to be here,” she said. “Coming here and following my mom and grandfather’s footsteps was a great decision. I love it every time I think about it.”

## The only choice

In the early 1970s, Carter Briggs ('77) narrowed his college choices to two schools — Austin Peay and Ole Miss. As a sports fan, Briggs liked the University of Mississippi’s football dominance in the early 1960s, but he kept feeling the pull of the local school where his father, Creson, attended.

“When I got to thinking about it, Briggs don’t get too far from Clarksville. There’s no place like home,” he said. “I was there through the Fly (Williams) era. We used to climb through the window to see the ball games.”

His wife, Pamela Ragan Briggs ('83, '86), earned a bachelor’s and a master’s degree from Austin Peay, and their daughter, Grace Catherine Briggs ('18), recently became the third generation to graduate from Austin Peay.







## International legacy

This fall, Phoenix Tarpy returned to Austin Peay. Years ago, she had lived in Emerald Hills, the campus' family housing complex, while her mother, Tina Rousselot de Saint Céran, finished her undergraduate degree. In August, Phoenix arrived at APSU with a Dean's Scholarship and a strong connection to the campus. In addition to her mother, her grandfather (Barry Arnold), her aunt (Melanie Arnold Mantz), her uncle (Farron Mantz) and her stepfather (Renaud) all earned degrees from Austin Peay. And her mother, Tina, spent five years at Austin Peay, establishing what was then called the Office of International Education.

"My husband, Renaud Rousselot de Saint Céran, was the first French exchange student hosted by APSU," Tina said. "After his exchange program, he decided to return and complete his B.A. degree in foreign languages."

Now Phoenix is continuing the family legacy of attending Austin Peay.

# GULLEDGE NAMED “SCIENTIST OF THE WEEK” AT NATIONAL LAB

The night sky is darker, the stars brighter, in Mount Pleasant, Tennessee. The rural town sits about an hour south of Nashville, where the heavens are dimmed by excessive light pollution, and as a girl, Deborah Gulledge became curious about the brilliant stars above her home.

“I was always interested in astronomy,” she said.

While still a high school student, this growing interest in the sciences took her to Austin Peay, where she attended the state’s Governor’s School for Computational Physics one summer.

She returned to campus as a physics major, and in the last four years, she has traveled twice to the Cerro Tololo Inter-American Observatory, high in the Andes Mountains of Chile, to conduct research for the international Dark Energy Survey.

This research has also taken her to Fermilab — the U.S. Department of Energy’s national laboratory — as an undergraduate research intern, and in January, lab officials named her Fermilab’s Scientist of the Week.

“It was exciting that they picked me,” she said. “They chose me based on

research I presented at the American Astronomical Society Meeting in Washington, D.C. — research I’ve done on the Dark Energy Survey.”

Gulledge graduated in May, and she is now pursuing her Ph.D. at

Georgia State University.

“I have loved it here, and I would not want to go anywhere else for undergrad,” she said. “It’s a small school, but the physics department is the most incredible department I could ever ask for.”

# SOUTHEASTERN **GRASSLANDS** **INITIATIVE**





Earlier this year, Dr. Dwayne Estes, professor of botany, was eating lunch with Henry Paulson, the former U.S. Treasury secretary under President George W. Bush, and his wife, Wendy Paulson, when the conversation suddenly turned to southern prairies. Between bites, Estes explained that for thousands of years, grasslands covered much of the southern United States, but today, more than 90 percent of this vast habitat, along with the different creatures that called these grasslands home, has disappeared.

“The Paulsons, Hank and Wendy, they’re major conservationists, so sitting at the table with them was pretty great,” Estes said.

For the past year, the APSU professor has been traveling the country to drum up support for these endangered ecosystems, delivering 84 presentations to more than 3,000 people. On May 18, 2018, the Tennessee Wildlife Federation recognized his efforts by awarding him with its coveted “Conservationist of the Year” award.

“Grassland conservation is becoming a movement whose time has come,” Estes said.

It’s a topic he’s been passionate about throughout his career, and last year, Estes realized Austin Peay was prepared to lead this national conservation effort. In January, Estes and Theo Witsell, a botanist and ecologist with the Arkansas Natural Heritage Commission, launched the Southeastern Grasslands Initiative (SGI). Housed within Austin Peay’s Center of Excellence for Field Biology and the APSU Department of Biology, the burgeoning organization is forming an impressive array of collaborators and partnerships, including the University of Texas’s Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center, the University of North Carolina’s North Carolina Botanical Garden, the Society for Range Management and Roundstone Native Seed LLC.

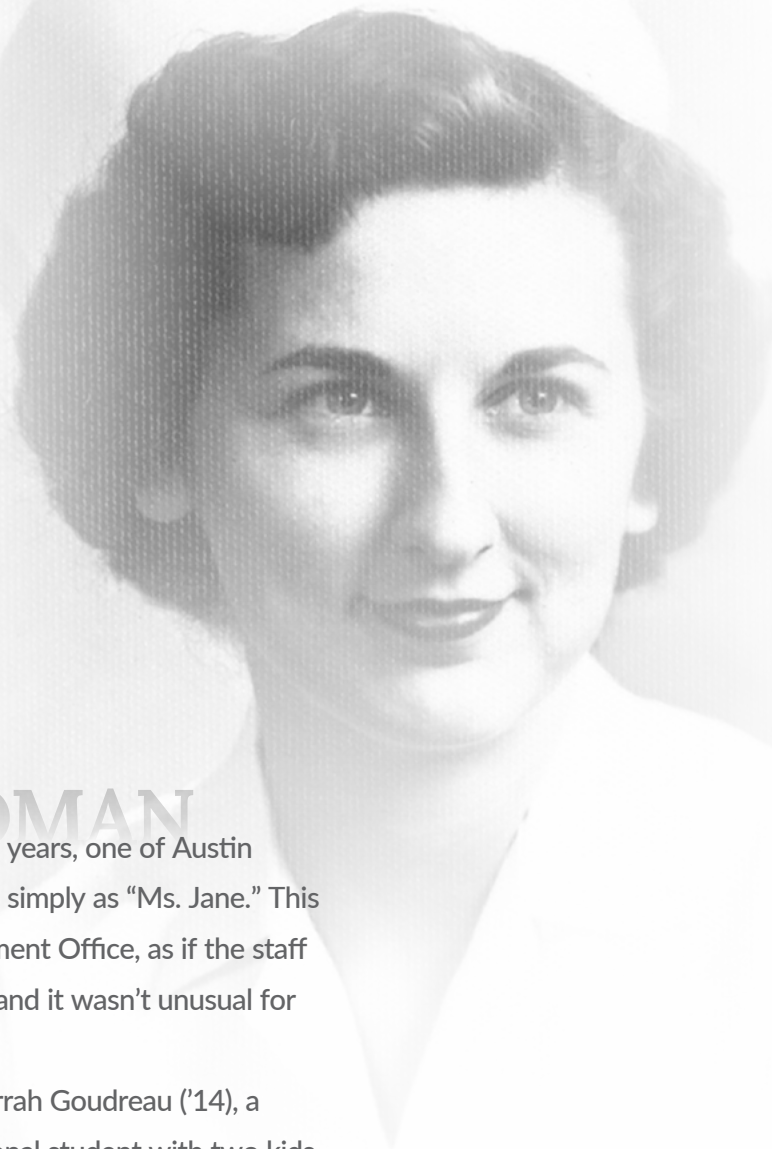
SGI was designed to serve a 23-state region across the southern United States, spanning from New York City to Columbia, Missouri, south to Miami, Florida, and Corpus Christi, Texas, with the goal of hiring regional coordinators to serve in different key areas.

“This initiative is an attempt to restore bits and pieces of this ecosystem that we’ve lost over the last 200 years,” Estes said. “While grasslands as a whole in the Southeast have declined by 90 percent, down from nearly 100 million acres two centuries ago, many types, such as the prairies around Clarksville, are 99 percent gone. The explorers who described these prairies in the 1790s, they described buffalo and prairie chickens — things we don’t have anymore. You have to remember, it was originally grassland for thousands and thousands of years before we got here.”



# A Legacy of Giving:

Meet Jane Doe



## THE MYSTERY WOMAN

The name “Jane Doe” sounds a bit impersonal, so for years, one of Austin Peay State University’s anonymous donors was known simply as “Ms. Jane.” This alias was often whispered in the University’s Advancement Office, as if the staff worried they were revealing too much of her identity, and it wasn’t unusual for students to cry when mentioning her name.

“I met Ms. Jane a while later, and she is amazing,” Sarrah Goudreau ('14), a former APSU nursing student, said. “I was a nontraditional student with two kids. I have no family here. It was rough. For somebody to say, ‘Here you go.’ I can’t even explain it.”

Goudreau wept in the Advancement Office that day, five years ago, when she received a scholarship, endowed by Ms. Jane, that provides single parents with \$3,000 to earn a degree.

In December 2017, this anonymous donor passed away, and the University community learned the real name of its mysterious benefactor — Evelyn Jane McCampbell.

“When I think about what she did anonymously, when I look at the magnitude of what she’s done for Austin Peay, I want everyone to know about her generosity and selflessness,” Laurie Vinson, McCampbell’s friend and financial adviser, said.



## THE REAL "MS. JANE"

Evelyn Jane McCampbell was born June 4, 1931, in Jackson, Tennessee, and after an impressive high school career — she was on the National Honor Society — she enrolled at Lipscomb University. A few years later, she headed south to Memphis to study at the University of Tennessee Nursing School. That's where she met Dr. Frank G. McCampbell Jr., her husband and partner for 40 years.

Frank, an obstetrician, set up a small practice in Clarksville, with his wife as chief nurse and, after she earned a business administration degree from Union University, manager of the medical office.

Together, the couple helped deliver hundreds of children in Clarksville-Montgomery County,

but the McCampbells never had any children of their own. Instead, they invested in the community.

"She offered advice, compassion and support to many community women during those years," the Signature HealthCARE Hall of Fame entry on Ms. Jane states. "Evelyn became a longtime member of the University of Tennessee Extension's Home Demonstration Club to help rural women learn to store food and other effective ways to provide for their families suffering from poverty."

When Frank passed away, leaving his wife with a large estate, she developed an estate plan to continue helping young people in the area. That's when Evelyn

McCampbell became Austin Peay's Ms. Jane. She initially established a nursing scholarship and a special education scholarship, but she wanted to do more.

Through the Community Foundation, she developed the McCampbell Helping Hands Fund, with Austin Peay as a major benefactor. Because of her, a substantial check is sent to the University every year to fund scholarships for multiple individuals.

"This was most beneficial in helping me achieve my goal in completing my degree," Ciara Buxton, a special education major and scholarship recipient, said. "I

received a partner in my education. Thank you for believing in me, and thank you for investing in me."

McCampbell wanted her estate to go to

something meaningful, to provide a better life for local families. Each year, she looked forward to meeting students at Austin Peay's Annual Scholarship Dinner. She shared their excitement for the future, and she later confided to Vinson that these scholarships were the one thing she was most proud of in her life.

"Without the scholarship, I wouldn't be able to afford to finish school," Shamika Moss, nursing student and scholarship recipient, said. "Three children and divorced. It means a lot financially."

Again, there are tears.

## Harrison new athletics director

This summer, Gerald Harrison, former Duke University senior associate director of athletics/internal affairs, was named Austin Peay's athletics director.

Prior to his time at Duke, Harrison worked for the University of Tennessee's football program under Hall of Fame head coach Phillip Fulmer. At his last two schools, he served at the administrative level for athletics departments that won national championships in multiple sports, including football and men's basketball.

"I could not be more excited to accept this position," Harrison said in July. "Our primary goal will be to make the experience of our student-athletes the best it can possibly be as we strive to have a championship program athletically, academically and socially. And we'll do so with the highest degrees of integrity and sportsmanship.

"Working alongside the student athletes, coaches, staff, the community of Clarksville and the Governors' passionate fans and supporters, we will build on past achievements and embark on an extremely bright future for Austin Peay athletics. I can't wait to get started."







## A LEAGUE OF THEIR OWN:

### Five APSU head coaches earn top OVC honors

Success starts at the top; without the right person to lead a program, even the most talented players can be stymied. At Austin Peay, leadership has become a key focus of the University's mission, and that focus was evident last year when five of the athletics department's head coaches took home Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year honors.

It started last fall, with both Taylor Mott and Will Healy winning the award for volleyball and football, respectively. Mott orchestrated the merry band of free-wheeling Governors who became the seventh team in OVC history with a 30-win season. Healy, in addition to taking Austin Peay from the OVC cellar to a consensus top-25 program, also received the STATS FCS Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year recognition in January.

While Healy was in Frisco, Texas, to accept his honor, first-year head coach Matt Figger was

transforming Austin Peay men's basketball in his image — a gritty, tough, no-nonsense group that ascended all the way to third in the league by the end of the regular season. That success led Figger to his own Coach of the Year honor.

When Sara Robson elected to step away from the women's golf program as head coach and into an administrative role, the foundation was already set for success; the Gobs won Robson's final tournament as head coach and Amy McCollum, her replacement, continued that success into the spring with four top-five finishes and a final-round 301 — the best in program history at the OVC Tournament — to close out the season. Robson and McCollum were named co-OVC Women's Golf Coach of the Year, the first pair of coaches from the same program to earn the honor.





## MEN'S BASKETBALL HOSTS POSTSEASON GAME

During Matt Figger's first season as head men's basketball coach, he led the Govs to a third-place regular season finish in the Ohio Valley Conference and a semifinal run in the OVC Tournament in Evansville, Indiana. That success yielded an invitation to the

CollegelInsiders.com Tournament, a national postseason event in its 10th year. The Govs hosted and won the opening-round game, the John McClendon Classic, before losing in the second round to the University of Illinois at Chicago.







## PHILLIPS SWINGS AT HOME RUN DERBY

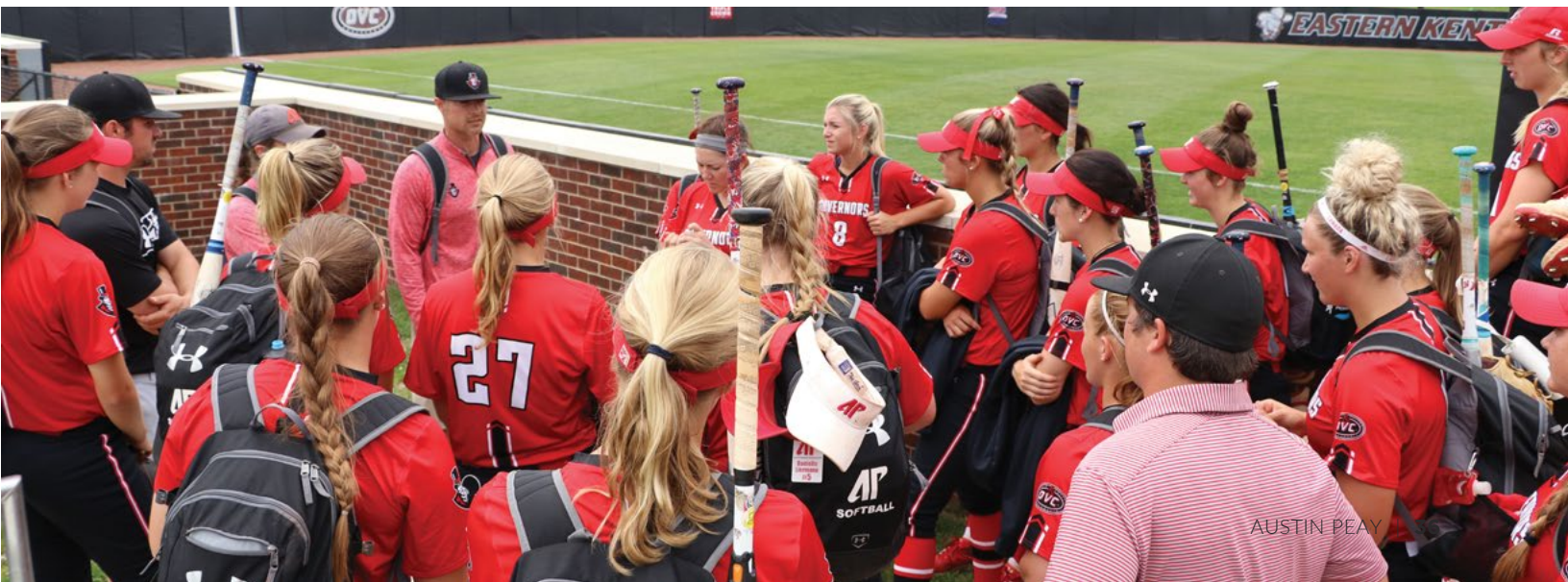
In June, first baseman Parker Phillips advanced to the semifinals of the Rocket Mortgage by Quicken Loans College Home Run Derby in Omaha, Nebraska. He was the first Governors player invited to the event and only one of six chosen nationally. He advanced to the second round with a 13-home run opening-round performance, but Nic Ready of the U.S. Air Force Academy took home the title in the three-round event. Phillips tied Austin Peay's single-season home run record in 2018, hitting 19. He has 31 home runs through two seasons at APSU.

a former Austin Peay State University Governors football player, is a marketing consultant at the Sinclair Broadcast Group in Chattanooga, Tennessee.





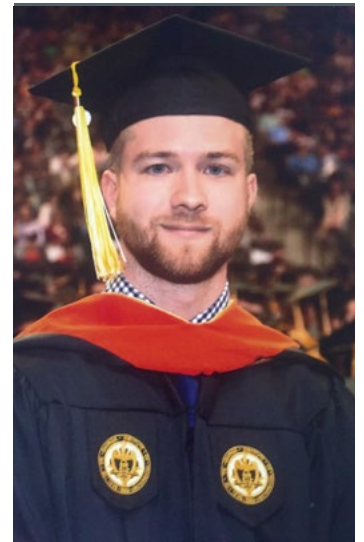
**STACY JANTZI ('11),**

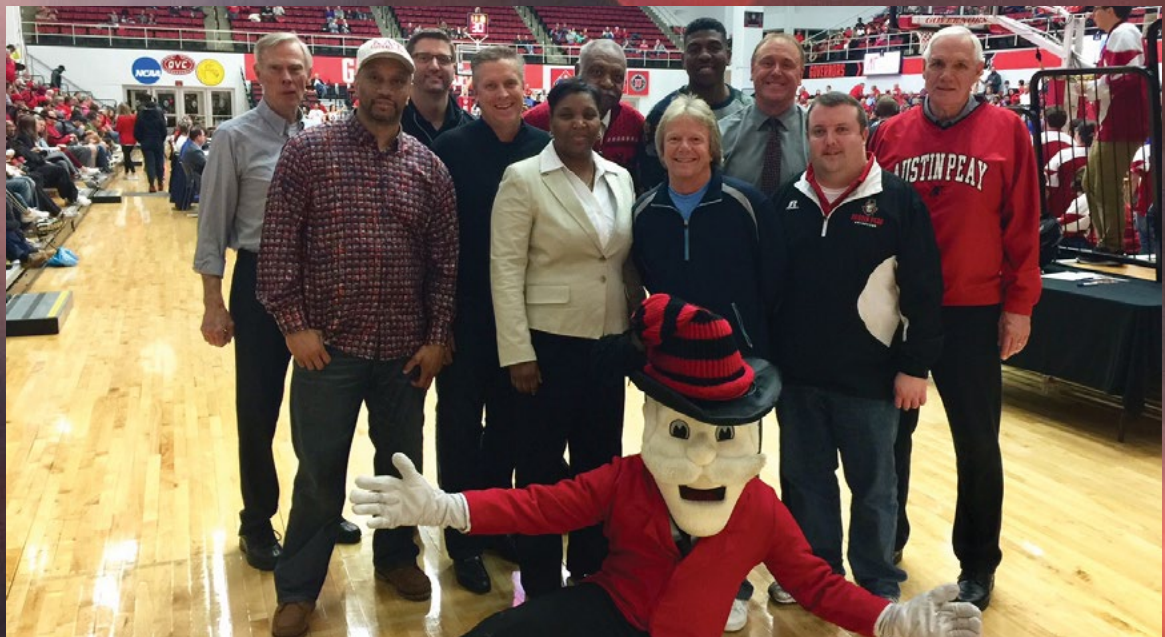

# LEADING THE WAY

## CHARITABLE GIFT ANNUITY

In 2010, Dr. Harold S. Pryor ('46) established APSU's first gift annuity. That gift is now changing the lives of students.

### What is a charitable gift annuity?

A charitable gift annuity combines a charitable gift with an income for life. A gift annuity allows you to make a gift to the APSU Foundation and the program of your choice while benefitting from the following:

- Safe, fixed income for your life and the life of a loved one
- Tax savings — immediately and in the future
- Favorable treatment of capital gains, if funded with appreciated assets
- Membership in a giving society at the level of your gift

### How does a charitable gift annuity work?

In exchange for an irrevocable gift of cash, publicly traded securities or other assets, the APSU Foundation agrees to pay one or two individuals a fixed annual income backed by the resources of the APSU Foundation.

The minimum age to establish a gift annuity is 65. If you are using interest from CDs or dividends from other investments to assist in your living expenses, a gift annuity may be an option as the rate of return is greater than a CD and provides tax benefits.

Your income from a charitable gift annuity will never decrease, nor can you outlive it. This one-time purchase can provide a stable annual income and make a difference in the lives of APSU students.
