She has served multiple combat tours with Special Operations and Psychological warfare duties for both Fort Bragg and Fort Campbell. She was awarded the Bronze Star for her actions in Afghanistan.

Yolonda earned her associate's degree in Arts from the University of Phoenix in 2005, and she went on to complete her bachelor's degree in Business Management from that same institution in 2008. In 2020, she graduated from Austin Peay State University with a degree in Culinary Arts. She is currently working toward earning her Master's degree in Leadership and Organization from Austin Peay.

Yolonda has been the National Commander of Women Veterans of America National since 2016. In 2022, she spearheaded the inaugural Education Summit for Women Veterans during Women's History Month in partnership with Austin Peay. Also in 2022, Yolonda and other members of the Women Veterans of America, along with Leadership Clarksville and Big Brothers Big Sisters of Clarksville, partnered with the Harwood Institute in hosting a community-wide event to discuss findings from their report, *Clarksville-MoCo: Stepping Into the Future*.

She is responsible for coordinating the annual Delta Day on the Hill at both the state and national levels.
